

Information for persons seeking funding for Justice Initiatives Grants

The Justice Initiatives Committee makes grants twice a year, in January and June.

The committee takes seriously its charge to be good stewards of the funds allotted to it for distribution. In order for the grant to be qualified for funding, the following requirements must be met: (1) a parishioner of St Albert must be actively involved with the organization as a volunteer, employee or board member; (2) the grant request must specify a specific need to benefit the organization's clients; (3) the organization must support a social justice need.

If your request is approved by the committee, you will be notified that a grant has been approved by a member of the Justice Initiatives Committee, and a check request will be sent to the parish bookkeeper. The committee member who notifies the organization will be responsible for receiving documentation that shows the money was spent as specified in the grant. Failure to provide such information will disqualify the organization for consideration of receiving money in the future. It is expected that grant funds will ONLY be used for the specified purpose. Typically, the supporting receipts or documentation should be forwarded within 3 months of receipt of the check.
